

RULES FOR CLRC MEMBERS

The CLRC, like any other club, depends on its members for its existence. This is your club and as a member, you share not only in the benefits of membership but also the responsibilities. The following are expected to be observed by all members:

1. No smoking in the Clubhouse.
2. Illegal conduct of any kind will result in forfeiture of Club membership and forfeiture of all dues, initiation fees, and key card fees. **ILLEGAL CONDUCT WILL BE REPORTED TO LAW ENFORCEMENT AUTHORITIES. THE CLUB RETAINS THE RIGHT TO INITIATE CIVIL PROCEEDINGS AGAINST ANY MEMBER OR PERSON WHO ENGAGES IN ANY ILLEGAL CONDUCT WHILE IN THE CLUBHOUSE OR WHILE ON ANY PROPERTY UNDER THE CONTROL OF THE CLUB.**
3. Members are encouraged to help at a Club “open house” at least four times a year.
4. Members are encouraged to volunteer to help on “work Saturdays” at least four times a year.
5. All members are expected to help keep the Clubhouse clean.
6. No member will put any type of equipment on the Club layout without first registering with the Yardmaster.
7. The Yardmaster has sole and exclusive authority to determine run-time and sequence of train operation and has sole and exclusive authority to order any equipment off of the Club layout.
8. All trains run on the Club layout are run solely at the risk of the member. The Club assumes no responsibility and will not be responsible for any damage to any equipment while it is on or operating on the Club layout.
9. Tools and equipment supplied by the Club for use by a member are strictly for use in the Clubhouse and are not to be removed from the Clubhouse without prior permission of a Club officer or director.
10. Members will respect rolling stock and other property owned by the Club and other members and will at all times exercise reasonable care to ensure that they do not damage rolling stock and other property owned by Club or other members.
11. Please respect our neighbor's property by not littering outside the clubhouse.

This may seem like a lot of rules but most of them are common sense and shouldn't be hard to follow. If we all cooperate we'll all enjoy what the club has to offer.
